

NATIONAL ONE-ON-ONE BASKETBALL ASSOCIATION (NOOBA)

TOURNAMENT SANCTIONING POLICY

This policy outlines the requirements, standards, and fees for tournaments seeking official sanctioning by the National One-on-One Basketball Association (NOOBA). Sanctioning ensures that all NOOBA events maintain professional management, consistent rules, and fair opportunities for players to earn ranking points under the national system.

1. Criteria for Sanctioning

A. Administrative Requirements

- Submit the NOOBA Sanctioning Application Form at least 8 weeks prior to your event.
- Pay the required sanctioning fee (see Fee Schedule below).
- Provide current Public Liability Insurance and venue safety compliance.
- Nominate a Tournament Director and at least two NOOBA-approved referees.
- Agree to uphold the NOOBA Official Rules, Code of Conduct, and Ranking System.

B. Event Standards

- Courts must use official NOOBA layout (Defensive Line, Tie-Breaker Shootout Zone, Free 3-Point line, etc.).
- Venue must provide safe playing conditions, adequate lighting, and first aid facilities.
- Event signage must display NOOBA branding on score tables and promotional material.
- Use NOOBA-approved draw format and report results electronically.

C. Reporting & Conduct

- Submit complete match results within 48 hours of tournament completion.
- Record and report any player or spectator misconduct immediately.
- Submit photos, highlights, and post-event summary for NOOBA publication.

2. Sanctioning Fee Schedule (2026 Season)

Event Category	Scale / Description	Sanction Fee (AUD)	Inclusions
Local Qualifier	Club or regional event (50–100 players)	\$250	Use of NOOBA name, rulebook, basic ranking points, website listing

State Qualifier	City or regional event (100–250 players)	\$500	Full rulebook, referee support, ranking points, calendar inclusion
State Championship / Major Event	250–400 players	\$750–\$1,000	Full ranking system, NOOBA media coverage, official seeding
National Championship / Invitational	400+ players	\$1,500+	National ranking allocation, branding support, referees, promotion

Optional Add-ons:

- NOOBA Referee Appointments: +\$200
- Results Upload & Ranking Admin: +\$100
- Tournament Director Training: +\$150

3. Benefits to Organizers

Sanctioned tournaments receive:

- Listing on the NOOBA National Tournament Calendar
- Access to official rulebooks, ranking systems, and technical guides
- Use of NOOBA logos and promotional materials
- Eligibility for state and national ranking points
- Referee and tournament management support
- Inclusion in NOOBA's media, social, and sponsorship network

4. Sanctioning Application Process

1. Complete the NOOBA Sanctioning Application Form.
2. Submit via email to **national1on1basketball@gmail.com**.
3. NOOBA reviews your application within 14 days.
4. Upon approval, an Official Sanction Certificate and branding pack are issued.

7. Player Entry Fees & Revenue Model

Entry fees ensure that each NOOBA-sanctioned event remains financially viable, professionally run, and rewarding for both players and organizers.

Category	Event Duration	Entry Fee (AUD)	Includes
Junior Local / Regional	1 Day	\$55	Court hire, referees, medals, insurance, ranking points
Open Local / Regional	1 Day	\$65	Court hire, referees, prize fund, ranking points
State Qualifier	2 Days	\$85	Full ranking points, awards, official referees, PR listing
National Championship / Invitational	2–3 Days	\$125	Premium event, full national ranking points, media coverage, trophies

Revenue Distribution Example (Local Event – 100 Players @ \$60 = \$6,000 Total)

Venue hire / equipment: \$1,000

Referees / officials: \$800

Administration / insurance: \$600

Medals / prizes: \$500

NOOBA Fee: \$500

Promotion / media: \$300

Net Surplus (Host & NOOBA Fund): \$2,300

Recommended Revenue Split:

- 80% retained by host club or venue
- 20% allocated to NOOBA for national operations
